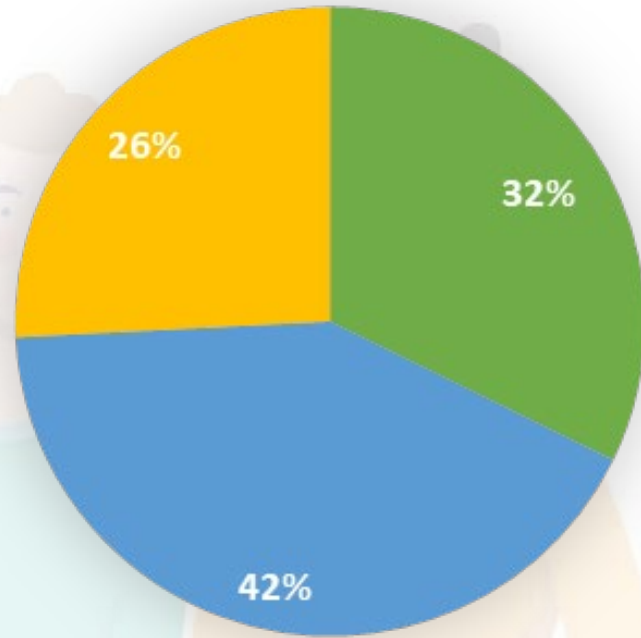

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Digitalisation as a chance for rural areas



- Training programmes dedicated to develop rural digital champions, combining technical, legal, management ...skills
- Public sector has to invest in less populated areas
- Local developed E-centres
- Digital connection should now be regarded as basic infrastructure
- Emphasize that connectivity infrastructure will booster economic development
- Digitalisation as inclusive partnership
- digital services in rural areas make them more attractive and reduce depopulation; a good infrastructure is key
- Allow access to other services education, health... ... filling the gap with urban areas
- Supporting local initiatives needed to coverage in rural areas

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Sustainable mobility solutions to connect rural areas with urban centres



- Proper involvement of citizens and stakeholders in co-creating new solutions
- Think mobility in terms of access to social activities as much as for work and educational purposes to make it attractive for young people.
- Enhance the development of travel chains
- Need for better information campaigns before new mobility solutions are proposed
- Think less about connecting villages with cities and focus on connecting village to village.
- Think about rural enterprises' mobility needs
- Political courage / visionary local leaders
- invest more on maritime mobility to connect coastal rural areas and minor islands
- Sharing data
- Strengthening of sharing of assets and rides
- Be careful with new smart/tech-driven solutions as a large size



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Social economy as catalyst to boost resilience and town transition in rural areas



- Government funds to the use of internet
- There is a need for supporting rural social enterprises with legal documents, applying for funding, etc. - a one stop shop for these enterprises that does not add unnecessary administrative barriers
- FairBnB.coop social alternative to airbnb.com
- Adopt action/activities to the needs of the local community through participatory approach
- Social economy is seen as „filling the gap“ in missing services and infrastructures in the rural area. But it is much more and it has to be recognized and rewarded.
- promoting cooperation between local stakeholders from different sectors
- Supports for organisations with professional skills such as bookkeeping
- Give real skills to rural people to enjoy the benefits of digitalization
- Make unpaid work visible,



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Rural youth as leaders of change



- TOURISM yes BUT... be respectful with local needs (housing for example)
- Mainstreaming youth boards/lags
- Youth LAG
- support units to engage young people (similar to EIP Agri)
- Campus Rural/ Rurasmus
- Rural youth ambassadors - talking rural in an urban context

- How municipalities can implement the rural pact?

- Set up local committees for rural pact
- Innovation gathers people together
- Top-down bureaucracy has to come closer to bottom-up.
- Bring the relevance of culture to discussion
- Need to bring cultural actors into the picture
- Need to finance pilot projects regarding carbon farming and forestry
- Need to highlight attractive benefits of rural living for youth; youth employment opportunities state-supplemented
- Use Regional Rural Networks of LAGS
- Listen to stories and the importance of dialogue with locals
- Collaboration + cooperation
- Horizon call of proposals should fit local and regional needs



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Place-based approaches for rural development: LEADER, CLLD and Smart Villages



- "Smart" multi-funding
- Know what is feasible and what is not. Take the action under the conditions you have rather than not to do it at all.
- Develop a local vision at territorial level
- Try to make the arrival of migrants a Chance for rural areas
- Young people's needs to be represented in a direct way - inclusion
- Strong leadership is extremely important for rural development
- We need smooth multifunded LEADER/CLLD approach.
- The current model of CLLD multi-fund is not being taken up by member state decision makers
- Agricultural budget is jealous and does not let resources for RD.
- Enthusiasts make the difference
- Foster cooperation between responsible ministries to make Multifund approaches realistic
- More funding that reflects needs on the ground
- Shared knowledge centers
- Have a common vision is key
- Translate the presented good practice into ALL EU languages to
