## Establish A Clear <u>Policy Framework</u> and <u>Objective</u>



- Established a new Department of Rural and Community Development
- National Social Enterprise Policy 2019-2022
- 'Our Rural Future' 2021 2025 dedicated rural SE actions
- > 2023 OECD Review of Social Enterprise/Entrepreneurship in IE
- > 2023 Social Enterprise Rural Ideas Fora
- 2023 Mapping Social Enterprises and Impact on Sustainable Rural Development in IE



### 2023–1<sup>st</sup> SE Baseline Data Collection Exercise UE23

- Annual Median Income Rural € 80,000, Urban € 250,000
- Similar income levels from trading goods/services but rural less Governmental.
- The more rural the area the higher the density of social enterprises
- More prominent in disadvantaged compared to affluent areas
- Rural less diversified 55% in Childcare/training/environmental
- Rural ≥ Community Infrastructure and Local Development
- Rural 44%/Urban 29% part time workers aged over 50
- IE Census 2022 Population Growth in all local authority areas nationally
- 'Our Rural Future' Policy Remote working, IT Hubs, Town Centre First Policies encourage retention of younger workers and families in rural areas

## **Rural Proofing and Social Enterprise**

- Many SE national policies equally important to rural and urban

- Targetted supports for community based social entrepreneurs
- Regional procurement initiatives both public and private/corporate level
