What are the challenges?

- Few women farmers, when women own farms, very small
- Little access to lifelong learning
- Limited knowledge about the type of support women need for their farm and rural innovations





What are we going to do?

- GRASS CEILING is a multi-actor project that will increase women-led socio-ecological innovations in farming, the rural economy and in rural communities
- How? Our living labs are at the heart of the project, we will work with and learn from women, and they will educate stakeholders, men and women, about their needs

What have we learned?

- Women have a different approach to innovation
- The scale is different very important for rural and remote rural areas
- Have an ecological focus but motivated by profit
- Not constrained by cultural norms and practices in agriculture
- Women need mentors and networks







Going forward

- Finance/ banks need to understand and support women's innovations
- Women need to be represented in mainstream organisations, such as Copa-Cogeca, who shape agricultural and rural policy
- Mentors and women's networks can be sidelined
- Learn from the innovators!
